

What is the campus association?

The University of Western Ontario Freedom Party Association is an on-campus extension of the Freedom Party of Ontario, a fully-registered provincial political party which promotes individual rights and freedoms.

Freedom Party believes that the *purpose of government* is to *protect* our freedom of choice, *not* to restrict it.

The campus club was formed to provide a forum to discuss and promote political, economic, and social issues from a laissez-faire, free-market point of view. By emphasizing less government intervention and the recognition of *individual* (as opposed to *group*) rights, we hope to create an awareness of our ever-deteriorating individual freedoms and responsibilities and to help reverse this dangerous trend.
