## Tap water restored to 20 apartments

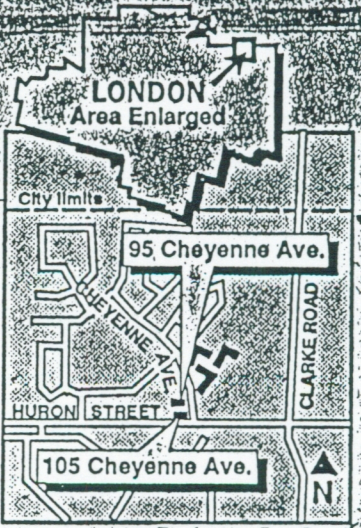
The service had been shut off for plumbing repairs after a sewage backup.

Tap water was restored to tenants at 105 Cheyenne Ave. Thursday afternoon, about 14 hours after service was cut to the 20 units in east London.

Water was shut off about 10 p.m. Wednesday to repair a sewer blockage that backed up toilets and tubs. The water was about 2.5 centimetres (one inch) deep in many ground-floor apartments.

Sultana Elieff, co-owner of the building with husband, Elija, said the plumber fixed everything.

The Elieffs, who also own the adjacent 20-unit building at 95 Cheyenne, have been asked by the Middlesex-London district health unit to rid both buildings of an "infestation" of cockroaches. Bob Carson, director of environmental health, said the Elieffs have not complied with a previous order to rid 95 Cheyenne of the vermin.
