

Quebec Not Concerned.

Montreal, Feb. 28.—The new Lord's Day Act, which does into force tomorrow, will be absolutely without effect in the Province of Quebec, as the Legislative Assembly has taken advantage of the permission granted by the Federal Act to pass laws for its own Province, and this has been passed by the House, which is now in session at Quebec. This amended Act contains provisions which confirm all Provincial and municipal legislation now existing with regard to Sunday observance. All companies which had charters from the Provincial Government permitting them to do business on Sundays still have that right. The excursion trains may run, Jews may work on Sunday, provided that they observe Saturday as a day of rest. Places of amusement where admission is charged may still keep open where they had the right to do so under the old Act.
