# Malcolm running in London North

Sunday shopping will be a major issue for the Freedom Party in the London North byelection.

Barry Malcolm, who ran in last year's provincial election in London North, will contest the seat again. He believes the ongoing shopping debate will focus atten-

tion on his party's emphasis on individual responsibility and choice. His party believes the purpose of government is to protect freedom of choice, he said, not restrict it.

"I will push this issue strongly

because it typifies the policies of all other parties. . . . We believe the individual should make the important choices affecting their lives, whereas my opponents believe the government should be making those choices for you."

Malcolm also said he supports freedom of choice on abortion as an expression of women's individual responsibility for their bodies, but he would limit public expenditures under OHIP to cases rape, incest or where a mother's life is endangered.

Malcolm drew 534 votes in the last election. He hopes to double that number in the byelection. Malcolm, who turns 33 on Feb. 20, is a control operator at the Greenway Pollution Control Centre. He lives in the riding at 144 Homestead Cres.

A date has not been set for the byelection to replace Liberal Ron Van Horne.
